About the same time there also appeared the following quotation from a letter from Colonel Kinloch, who had so far back as 1852 strongly advocated the formation of rifle corps: -- Aberdeen and the plunder of its granite palaces must be such a glorious prize to the admiral of a Russian or foreign fleet, that the sooner the youth of Bon-Accord take up arms for their defence the better....
